**REDUCE, REUSE,  
RECYCLE & REBUY**

**REDUCE:** Buy durable, long lasting goods, a product that does not have to go to the landfill & select larger quantities in a single package.

**REUSE:** Repair, donate, or sell the item. Keep jars to store nails, pens, etc. Donate old clothing to Goodwill or Salvation Army. Wash & reuse plastic cups & storage bags.

**RECYCLE:** Look around, just about anything in your home/office that cannot be reused can be recycled into something new. Did you know plastic soda bottles could be the fiberfill in your ski jacket or t-shirt?

**REBUY:** This is closing the loop, when you purchase something that has been made from recycled products. This has economic and environmental benefits and saves resources for future generations. If your not buying recycled, you are not recycling.



**UNACCEPTABLE  
MATERIALS**

**The following items are  
NOT RECYCLABLE**

Plastic Bags including Grocery Bags, Styrofoam, Aluminum Foil, Car Tires, Yard Waste, Disposable Diapers, Waxed Cartons, Kitchen Waste, Wood, Plate Glass, Ceramic, Mirrors, Bubble Wrap or Paper and Cardboard Products that are wet or contaminated with food waste.

Many Grocery Stores including Albertsons, Kroger, Tom Thumb and Wal-Mart provide recycling bins for Plastic Grocery Bags.
